Small Pantry Support Network

In partnership with Hospitality House Food Pantry we drop off and pick up food in support of a number of small food pantries throughout the metro Detroit area.



The Great Apple Rescue

In partnership with Yad Ezra, we have rescued from a small orchard of 40 trees that would otherwise go to waste, along with apples from trees in neighbor's yards. In 2023 we rescued more than 1500 pounds of apples.



Serving Those That Served

Through the small pantry support network, Soldier's Angels was able to double the amount of food given to 250 veterans & their families. We also work closely with Volunteers of America to help feed those in their residental program.



Thanksgiving Distribution

Each year we partner with the Springfield Fire Department, sponsored by Ally Financial to distribute 400 full Thanksgiving dinners to the community. This program also supports Groveland Township and the Village of Holly.



Events & Catering Rescue

Often, caterers prepare more food than they can serve. In Partnership with Make Food Not Waste, we work with The Book Cadillac, Oakland University, Lawrence Tech, TED Climate Confrence and others to rescue delicious prepared food.














